

District Ranger Camp POW-WOW Rules

The following rules and regulations governing the Ranger Camp Pow Wow are outlined for your outpost's safety as well as their enjoyment of the available facilities. A Ranger Camp Pow Wow experience will never be forgotten by the boys or leaders, therefore it should be a good experience for all. The rules should be covered with your outpost so the boys and leaders understand what is expected of them. Safety and sanitation are items you as a commander must control in your outpost.

- 1. **FINGERPRINTING:** All Commanders, fathers, helpers etc. 18 years of age or older who attend Ranger Camp Pow Wow <u>MUST HAVE</u> Working with minors application and a background screening affidavit on file with the Northern California and Nevada District Royal Rangers Office. You may bring these forms with you to camp.
- 2. **KEEP TRACK OF YOUR BOYS:** USE THE BUDDY SYSTEM! There are so many interesting places and things to see, your boys will be tempted to go off by themselves for adventure. In doing so they could become lost. HAVE TIMES THROUGHOUT THE DAY TO HAVE AN OUTPOST HEAD COUNT to see that all boys are accounted for. There will be free time for exploring as an Outpost. Impress on your boys the need to use the buddy system at all times. Commanders with Discovery age boys being 8, 9, and 10 years of age, may want to consider 8 year olds being accompanied by a father if possible. This will be up to each outpost to determine if a young boy is ready to attend a Ranger camp away from home.
- 3. FIRE SAFETY: Because of the time of year open fires may not be allowed. Check with the RR office the week prior to the Ranger Camp Pow Wow. Always be prepared to use Coleman stoves for cooking if cooking is necessary. (BBQ with Briquettes are permissible as long as they are above the ground or in a fire Barrel). Use proper fire safety such as having a 5-gallon container of water, bucket of sand, and shovel near the fire area. California law requires a ten-foot diameter circle cleared around the fire. Please supervise the building and control of your campfire and cooking.
- **4. WATER SAFETY:** A pool is located on the camp property. Bring your swim suits if you want to use the pool. Do not let the boys go to the pool by themselves. A commander must accompany them from their outpost. Outposts will be responsible for their boys! A schedule for pool use will be posted at the camp.
- **5. RESTROOMS AND SHOWERS:** This camp has showers and toilets. It is the responsibility of each camper to ensure the continued cleanliness of the bathrooms. They will be policed by the Ranger Security Patrol. If they need attention, please notify a member of the Ranger Security Patrol.

GENERAL RANGER CAMP RULES

- 1. Each Outpost Commander will be responsible for the conduct of his outpost.
- 2. **Do not bring <u>Ranger Kids or Girls/Women</u> to the Ranger Camp.** Ranger Camp is geared for Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition age Boys (3rd thru 12th grade) and Men.
- 3. There will be no washing of pots, pans, and dishes or for personal hygiene in the creeks or lakes. Please do not let the boys use the hose bibs to wash cooking utensils or personal hygiene. We must use water conservation practices on campouts, as well as at home. Commanders please convey the importance of not playing and wasting water when around the hose bibs.
- 4. All garbage must be kept in garbage bags. Check with registration table for the location of garbage cans and dumpsters.

5. No one is to take a short cut through another campsite!

- 6. The time between lights out (taps) and reveille must be respected which includes keeping quiet. The Ranger Security Patrol will make periodic checks through the campsites to enforce this guideline.
- 7. After lights out only flashlights will be allowed.
- 8. All campers will be restricted to their campsites after lights out.
- 9. No one is to be in the Assembly area except when he is instructed to go there.
- 10. All flashlights will remain off at the Council Service Area until after the council Service is over.
- 11. Rangers and Commanders are encouraged to wear their uniforms to the Council Service. Points will be awarded for doing so.
- 12. There will be no cutting of live trees or saplings. There are no lashing materials available at this site. You can bring your own lashing materials for the Big "E" projects and please take all materials home with you.
- 13. No "ditching" of tents or digging pits for fire or dishwater disposal.
- 14. All rules will be enforced by the Ranger Security Patrol. Commanders, please instruct all Rangers that the Ranger Security Patrol must be obeyed. The Ranger Security Patrol will take notes of infractions and turn them into the Ranger Security Patrol Chairman to be handled by the POW WOW Camp or District Commander.
- 15. Assemblies are noted on the schedule. **All campers are to attend all assemblies.** No one is allowed in the camp site area during an assembly without permission from the District Commander.
- 16. An outpost must participate in the Ranger Camp Pow Wow assemblies and events in order to receive their Ranger Camp Pow Wow patches. Just being at the Ranger Camp area will not qualify you to receive a patch. All campers must spend a minimum of one day and night to qualify for the patch.

RULES FOR FCF MEMBERS

- 1. FCF should coordinate the activities and craft classes with the Camp Commander.
- 2. All FCF Members are encouraged to wear their outfits to the council fire service on the first night. (LET'S DO IT UP BIG TIME FCF)!!! There will be a short FCF meeting at 6:00 pm on the first night in the FCF Village for instructions from the President on the evening activities. FCF Members should attend the Ranger Camp with their outpost and be part of the Ranger Camp. The only exception to this rule is if you are an FCF Staff member and your outpost is not attending.
- 3. Please remember FCF Members; we are here for the boys and to support our outposts.
- 4. The FCF Village should be open throughout the Ranger Camp Pow Wow for the boys and commanders to come through and see what FCF is all about.
- 5. There will be a FCF chapter meeting Friday night.

BIG "E" CAMPING AWARD

- 1. The Judging Team will do the Big "E" judging any time after morning assembly on day 3. The Team may come through while boys are at events or while boys are in camp. The same team will judge all outposts.
- 2. The first day is your Outpost Day; use it wisely to prepare for the "Big E" camping competition.
- 3. Encourage your boys to do their best.
- 4. You will need to bring your own poles, rope, and materials. No materials at the camp site.
- 5. All outposts scoring 90% and above will receive a First Place Trophy.
- Second and Third place trophies as follows:
 Second Place to those outposts scoring 80 89%
 Third Place to those outposts scoring 70 79%

OUTPOST SHARPEST UNIFORMS AWARD

Awards will be given to the top outposts that wear the sharpest uniforms to the day 2 evening council service. Complete outpost uniform will be: Khaki shirt, Khaki pants, bolo tie, belt, or the new utility uniform with new tack paints or blue jeans or your outpost uniform and Ranger Camp hat. Shoes and socks will <u>not</u> count at this event. (uniforms optional only needed if you want to be judged in this event) **Will be judged at Day 2's council service.**

- 1. All outposts scoring 90% and above will receive a first place Trophy.
- 2. Second Place to those outposts scoring 80 89%.
- 3. Third Place to those outposts scoring 70 79%.

THEME OUTPOST ENTRYWAY AWARD

- 1. Your outpost will have the first day of camp to construct a special entryway into your camp. Be creative, plan for something special, and be sure your boys do over 50% of the work using the Camp Theme.
- Judging Team will review the "Outpost Entries" points given as follows:
 Overall Appearance (1 50 points) Boys Participation (1 100 points)
 Originality (creativity, including use of mechanical devices) (1 50 points)
 TOTAL MAX points: 200
- 3. 1st thru 5th place trophies will be given in this event.

THEME FLAG AWARD

Each outpost should make a special standard / banner. Trophies will be awarded to the top five. Flag must include outpost number and should be designed similar to a patrol flag but with the theme in mind. Judging criteria: overall appearance and originality.

THEME ATTIRE AWARD

Each outpost is encouraged to dress in Theme attire. Trophies will be awarded for the top five. Judging criteria: uniformity all the outpost is dressed in theme attire, originality, boys' participation. **Judging at Day 3's council service.**

THEME BOLO TIE AWARD

1. The Outposts should make special bolo tie for the Ranger Camp Pow Wow and wear with their uniforms at council services or with their camp T-shirts, and camp hats during the day. This is optional, not required. (Generally the outpost makes the bolos in the outpost prior to coming to the Ranger Camp).

Submit your bolo tie to the registration table by 12:00 noon day 2 for judging.

- 3. Note: Make additional bolos for our guest speaker and other staff who appreciate these presentations.
- 4. Trophies for 1st thru 5th place will be given to the outpost.
- 5. * A note of importance: Bolo's should include the year of the camp. Your Outpost #. The Ranger Camp location. The bolo should also reflect the theme. Be creative and original. All these factors will be part of the judging criteria.

THEME FOOD DISH AWARD

Theme dish of your choice. Outposts will prepare a theme dish for the entire camp staff to experience. Food must be brought to staff headquarters on **Day 3 by noon.** 1st thru 5th will be awarded.

THEME VEHICLE AWARD (Race)

First your outpost will build your version of an attack vehicle on 4 wheels that can be pushed and or pulled by your Rangers. Vehicles must have a driver.

1. Your Attack Vehicle will be raced.

Trophies will be awarded to the top five in Race.

THEME VEHICLE AWARD (Show)

Second your Attack Vehicle will be Show Car Judged using Ranger Derby guide lines.

2. Your Attack Vehicle will be judged for workmanship.

Trophies will be awarded to the top five in Show and Race.
